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Position Title	National Junior Team and Development Team Coaching Roles

Biathlon in Australia	Biathlon Australia runs the sport of biathlon in Australian from participation to high performance. It is responsible for the development of athlete pathways and programs and entering athletes into IBU events of all levels.
	Biathlon Australia (BA) is the recognised member of the Australian Olympic Committee and the International Biathlon Union for the Winter Olympic sport of Biathlon in Australia.
	Biathlon as a sport in Australia is unifying and the organisations who have been involved in running biathlon in Australia are supporting the selection of one overseas training and IBU racing program for development, junior and open age athletes for IBU season 2022- 23.
	Two coaches, one male/one female are being sought with suitable experience coaching Youth and Junior aged athletes between 14years and 21years of age.
	The roles will be supported with a Team Manager and with a waxing expertise resource appointed where possible at IBU racing events.
	At the end of the 2022-23 season, Biathlon Australia is looking to appoint National Team coaches for a period of 1 year, who will coach in AUS and travel overseas with the Australian Teams for IBU 2023-24 season. Coaches appointed for the 2022-23 IBU season may be interested in continuing with AUS and being considered for the 1yr coaching contract from April/May 2023.

Position Purpose	The purpose of these positions is to lead the Austalian Biathlon Development and Junior National teams for the 2022-23 IBU season. It will involve providing coaching services and racing support services (shooting and skiing) to athletes selected to the Biathlon Australia National Development and Junior Biathlon Teams.
	Athletes on the National Development and National Junior Team will form the pool of athletes from which selection to race at 2022-23 IBU Junior Cups and to attend 2023 Youth/Junior World Championships will be selected. Other Team athletes may also race at IBU Regional Cups and Country National Championships and other country events as is determined.
	 The IBU events attended will include: 1) IBU Junior Cup No 1 - Martell (ITA) 5 Dec to 11 Dec 2022 2) IBU Junior Cup No 2 – Obertilliach (AUT) 12 Dec to 17 Dec 2022 3) IBU Junior Cup No 3 – Haanja (EST) 6 Feb to 12 Feb 2022





 4) IBU Junior Cup No 4/Jnr OECH – Madona (LAT) 13 Feb to 19 Feb 2022 5) 2023 YJWCH – Kazakhstan 3 Mar to 12 Mar 2022
The IBU is also holding a Training Camp in Martell from 26 November to 3 Dec 2022, which one of the Team coaches will be appointed to attend.
Other events will be added to the above list as Nothern Hemisphere racing calendars are released.
Between 18 Dec 2022 and 31 January 2023, the Australian Team(s) will be locating in a single location to undertake a 6 week training block between the end of IBU Junior Cup No 2 and the commencement of IBU Cup No 3. The postions will be expected to provide coaching support and training programs for athletes attending the training block, including attending local races.
The location of the training block is still being determined but is likely to be one of GER, SWE or USA.

Responsibilities	The following responsibilities are requirements of the role:
	 Daily coaching of athletes selected to the National Development Team and Natonal Junior Team, including shooting and skiing. Taking athletes to IBU Junor Cups and other events and providing coaching support including attending Team Captain's meetings, Official/Unofficial training and racing management. Driving team vans for training, racing and other purposes. Selecting athletes for relay teams and starting groups as per Biathlon AUS selection criteria's, communication to Biathlon Australia of the selections. Providing feedback to Biathlon Australia Board and Selection Committee regarding athlete performance. Foster a strong team culture and assist athletes develop a strong training ethic during the 6 week training programs for each level of athlete, personalised as required for the level of athlete including providing suitable training directions and communication to Biathlon Australia's social media and website mangers. The role will be 6 days a week with one day a week (as much as possible) provided for time away from the Team.

Team.
