COACH ACCREDITATION Trained Coach v Certified Coach

To become a Trained Coach, candidates must complete all required online modules. To become a Certified Coach, trained coaches must attend all relevant practical workshops and complete all practical coaching requirements.

Annual Requirements

All accredited Biathlon Australia coaches must have current First Aid qualifications, Working With Children's Check (WWCC) and be a financial member of Australian Biathlon Association

RECOGNITION OF PRIOR LEARNING (RPL) Candidates may be able to apply for Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) for some or all components of the Level 1 Coaching Fundamentals course if they are able to supply sufficient evidence of the relevant required competencies. UPDATING REQUIREMENTS To update their accreditation each coach must in a four-year period: – Complete a specific number of approved activities including a specific number of coaching hours, participation at workshops and c=seminars, continued professional development.
