### COACH ACCREDITATION Trained Coach v Certified Coach

To become a Trained Coach, candidates must complete all required online modules. To become a Certified Coach, trained coaches must attend all relevant practical workshops and complete all practical coaching requirements.

### Annual Requirements

All accredited Biathlon Australia coaches must have current First Aid qualifications, Working With Children's Check (WWCC) and be a financial member of Australian Biathlon Association

**RECOGNITION OF PRIOR LEARNING (RPL)** Candidates may be able to apply for Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) for some or all components of the Level 1 Coaching Fundamentals course if they are able to supply sufficient evidence of the relevant required competencies.
